## **Additional Procedures**

- Where possible, one hour before the engineer is due to arrive, non-essential crew should remain clear of the designated route from the entrance point (i.e. ladder, stairs etc..) to the wheelhouse or place of work, especially where the route is within enclosed spaces.
- Where possible the area should remain well ventilated via the opening of external doors or windows.
- Crew member/s assigned to escort the engineer from the entrance point to the place of work must wear suitable PPE.
- Where possible, the route from the entrance to the place of work should be via open deck, as opposed to within enclosed spaces.
- The place of work should be cleared of all crew not essential to the place of work preferably the area should be clear of all crew if they are not required.
- Unless necessary for the safety of the engineer, crew or vessel (i.e. during the embarkation and disembarkation). The engineer and crew should remain at least 2m apart.
